PILLAR UPDATES

Pillar 1

DIAGNOSTICS

The consultant continues leading the discussion between the scientific leads and patient and family partners. The research goals were presented to the Patient & Community Advisory Committee (PCAC) in January 2022 and PCAC members voted in favour of moving forward with creating a research protocol for the patient-priority project. The project will be using historical samples stored in the provincial (BC and ON) labs' freezers.

Pillar 2

PREVENTION AND RISK REDUCTION

Catherine Bouchard has replaced Patrick Leighton as one of the Co-Chairs for Pillar 2. Surveillance occurred at the sentinel sites this spring/summer 2021; analysis will begin soon on the sentinel sites' tick data. The veterinary surveillance program began as a pilot program this summer. Data analysis completed for the retrospective case-control study; in the process of writing up a manuscript. The prospective case-control study is on hold until spring 2022. The Innovation/Intervention Working Group finalized their protocol and are currently recruiting students and trainees to help roll out the project. The Modelling working group completed a proposal for use of their seed funds; the proposal is being vetted through PCAC before it is reviewed by the CLyDRN Executive Committee for approval.

Pillar 4

PATIENT AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, TRAINING AND KNOWLEDGE TRANSLATION

Conducted 38 virtual interviews with national healthcare practitioners: 2 additional interviews scheduled for next week. Knowledge Translation Porthole discussions on hold. The focus group discussions (barriers to preventative behaviours study) have been extended into Manitoba in addition to British Columbia, Ontario, Quebec, and Nova Scotia. 22 focus group discussions have been completed to date: no longer recruiting participants. Plan to start the analysis of the focus groups at the end of March/early April. The Pan-Canadian survey will be initiated in the summer 2022; currently writing up the protocol to submit to the REB. Currently exploring funding to develop a tick bite prevention bilingual website in Quebec. Brokered dialogue protocol was finalized, and the REB application package has been completed and will be submitted after institutional signatures have been obtained. Discussions continue with the filmmaker for the brokered dialogue project. The doctoral project on Indigenous experiences and perspectives on Lyme disease continues development. The Community Engagement Committee is underway: the first two (2) community members are awaiting orientation.

Pillar 3

CLINICAL SCIENCE AND HEALTH SERVICE RESEARCH

COHORT Study-Kingston, ON Site:

9 participants completed their Baseline visit; 8 participants completed 1-month, 3-month, and 6-month follow-up visits; 1 participant dropped out; 9-month follow-up visits are occurring over the next few weeks.

CLYME (Biobank) Study-Kingston, ON Site:

20 participants completed Baseline visit; 16 participants completed 1-month follow-up visit; 4 participants dropped out.

Both studies will re-launch participant recruitment for Lyme disease cohorts and healthy controls in the coming weeks at both sites.
