# PILLAR UPDATES

## Pillar 1

### DIAGNOSTICS

*The consultant continues leading the discussion between the scientific leads and patient and family partners. First draft of the research proposal has been created and vetted to Pillar 1 members for their feedback. Expecting the next revised draft to arrive soon for additional input before being circulated to PCAC members. The project will be using historical samples stored in the provincial (BC and ON) labs' freezers as well as collecting new prospective samples during the 2023 Lyme disease season.*

## Pillar 2

### PREVENTION AND RISK REDUCTION

*The Surveillance Working Group has doubled the scope of their planned surveillance sites for this spring/summer 2022. The veterinary surveillance program that began as a pilot program last summer will continue this summer with the same number of sites. Data analysis completed for the retrospective case-control study and writing up the manuscript. The prospective case-control study is being launched at both recruitment sites. The Innovation/Intervention Working Group finalized their protocol and continues to recruit students and trainees to help roll out the project. The Modelling Working Group completed a proposal for use of their seed funds; the proposal has been vetted through PCAC members and is being reviewed by the CLyDRN Executive Committee for approval.*

## Pillar 3

### CLINICAL SCIENCE AND HEALTH SERVICE RESEARCH

#### **COHORT Study-Kingston, ON Site:**

*10 participants have been enrolled (consented);  
9 participants completed their Baseline visit;  
8 participants completed 1-month, 3-month, and  
6-month follow-up visits; 6 participants completed  
9-month follow-up visit; 2 participants dropped out;  
12-month follow-up visits will commence  
between June-August 2022.*

#### **CLYME (Biobank) Study-Kingston, ON Site:**

*23 participants have been enrolled (consented);  
22 participants completed Baseline visit;  
16 participants completed 1-month follow-up visit;  
5 participants dropped out.*

*The Kingston site re-launched participant recruitment on May 1, 2022 for Lyme disease cohorts and healthy controls. The Lunenburg site will commence recruitment very soon.*

## Pillar 4

### PATIENT AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, TRAINING AND KNOWLEDGE TRANSLATION

*Conducted 43 virtual interviews with national healthcare practitioners. Knowledge Translation Porthole discussions on hold. The barriers to preventative behaviours study have begun coding the data from the 22 focus group sessions carried out across BC, MB, ON, QC, and NS. Data analysis will follow. The Pan-Canadian survey study has received REB ethical clearance. The study is expected to begin late June/early July 2022. Currently exploring funding to develop a tick bite prevention bilingual website in Quebec. Brokered dialogue protocol was finalized and received REB ethical clearance. The doctoral project on Indigenous experiences and perspectives on Lyme disease continues development. The Community Engagement Committee has been formed: seven (7) community members are undergoing orientation.*

*There are >40 active members, with several new members pending orientation. PCAC held advisory roles by providing feedback and input through surveys and discussions with Pillar 1-4 and the Project Grants Committee with different levels of engagement (co-design and collaboration). Various PCAC members hold leadership roles on the Executive Committee, Pillar Leads Committee, and Event Planning Committee (AGM and Lyme disease awareness events). PCAC is leading the implementation of the GRIPP2 tool for capturing patient engagement in research projects.*

*The Fundraising Committee changed its name to Project Grants Committee (PGC). *The New Frontiers Exploration grant was not successful in being funded; will look to re-apply in future competitions. Recently presented at Science Rendezvous: a virtual and in-person event for children and families held at various sites across Canada throughout May to help raise awareness about tick safety and Lyme disease. Will be presenting on the accomplishments of the Network to date, including the research projects under PGC, at the Kingston-Syracuse Pathway Conference, which is a collaboration between Queen's and SUNY (State University of New York) to advance cross-border collaborations in research, innovation, and economic development. There is a new Lyme disease survey posted on [myLyme.ca](http://myLyme.ca).*

## LYME DISEASE

**Website Update:** In the summer/fall 2020 the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) consulted with stakeholders from provincial/territorial Ministries of Health, researchers, health professionals, health professional associations, patient groups, and person with lived experience. As a result of the feedback received, the website now contains improved navigation, up-to-date scientific evidence, clear directions on tick bite prevention, answers to the most commonly asked questions, and information and available data on Lyme disease: <https://www.canada.ca/en/public-health/services/diseases/lyme-disease.html>. Areas identified by PHAC requiring additional information/clarity in the future include: comprehensive list of signs and symptoms, such as adding information on Lyme carditis; images of erythema migrans (EM) rashes on dark skin tones; explanation of laboratory diagnosis (testing) and its limitations; risks of getting Lyme disease; clinical diagnosis of Lyme disease; tick identification, testing, and attachment time; new interactive risk area maps; updated links to provincial/territorial resources; and links to Canadian resources for Lyme disease management.


### In-Person 2022 MEMBERS AGM & SCIENTIFIC MEETINGS
